1. Career Center/HS Seats Planning

- a. Ed Center Planning: https://www.apsva.us/engage/education-center/
 - i. Public meeting on Wednesday Oct 18 at Ed Center
 - i. Team (staff, students, ACI, etc.) have evaluated ten sites and narrowed down to three options presented, 2 programs and 1 expand W-L
 - ii. W-L would like additional seats, and do not want another program on their site ("competing")
 - iii. Physically, options can be online by 2021 (or even 2020) but it is dependent upon funding

b. Career Center Planning

- i. Working group targeted to start December
- ii. Discussion about the charge including neighborhood school and some disagreements around that portion
- iii. Form based code elements are a big question
- iv. What's the process for forming the committee? It will be assembled similar to a BLPC
- v. By May, working group will provide recommendations on phasing and elements; SB approves in June
- vi. Working group needs to balance flexibility with the need for seats
- vii. FAC will have a representative on the working group

2. Boundary processes

- a. Did not do a boundary tool but provided different options that align with the policy directives
- b. Two proposals from APS will be out next week, then will provide permutations on possible moves (6th graders; 6th and 7th graders; etc)
- c. Current proposals do not include program moves
- d. Recommendation to keep doing small group breakout sessions at the public meetings rather than sticky notes/yelling at meetings
- e. Alignment of elementary boundaries is not being considered in the MS process
- f. How are transfer waivers being handled?

- 3. AFSAP/CIP Process
 - a. APS grew by 3% compared to last year (up to 26,941 students on Sept 30)
 - b. Growth primarily at ES and MS; HS down a little but likely due to recent boundary changes
 - c. Accuracy K-12 >99% (pre-K 12 accuracy = 98.8%)
 - d. 29 out of 31 schools 90% accuracy or better
 - e. ES growth due to both kids coming into APS as well as high kindergarten cohorts (2200+ this year)
