1. Welcome: Greg Greeley, Chair, welcomed attendees to the meeting.

2. Approve Minutes: There were no corrections to the minutes.

3. Project Status-Jeff Chambers: Jeff Chambers briefly discussed the status of current projects.

4. **1300 Seats:** The three sites being considered for the 1300 seats were discussed. Main discussion points included:

- Concerns about timeline, specifically relating to Kenmore MS
- Site should be maximized and built flexible so not to preclude any future development
- If the Ed Center was renovated, how would it be used for swing space?
- What would be the demographics and walkability of each site? Where would the kids come from? Would it be a neighborhood school?
- How would instruction work with a smaller school of 1300 or a larger school of 3000? What would the impact be on sports and other extracurricular activities?
- Think beyond just 1300 in 2022 think toward a future possible 40,000 student district. What would the needs be at all levels?
- More detail from Instruction on the programs at each site
- Concerns about field space and access to sport and other extracurricular activities
- More coordination with the County on providing things like gym, pool, theater, etc. that would also be a benefit to the neighborhood.
