# 3. What are your department's three greatest areas of need?

#### **Listed Weaknesses**

- Staff capacity in specific areas including maintenance, storm water & energy management, security & emergency management
- Failure to recruit HVAC technicians due to non-competitive salary structure
- Lack of financial accountability for use of F&O Services by other departments

## **Listed Opportunities**

- Revise budget development process to meet changing needs of some core services
- Increase understanding that everyone in the system must contribute to saving energy and energy efficiency
- Move toward greater integration of APS and County transportation services
- Improve compliance and accountability within department

- Link projects to Community Energy Plan
- Collaborate with County on emergency management
- Provide schools with higher level of security

### **Threats**

- Continued unprecedented enrollment growth challenging all departmental resources
- Increased demand for services outpacing funding
- Constantly expanding community engagement processes resulting in decreased staff morale, potential loss of highly qualified staff and potential reduction of key stakeholder participation
