#### Secondary Programs


- No specified

# Background

- The new Standards of Accreditation (SOA) from the VDOE call for an increase in "Career Exposure, Exploration, and Planning" at the elementary, middle, and high school levels.
- There is an increased focus on helping students identify and demonstrate workplace skills that future employers will desire in their employees.

26 credits5 verified credits(reduced from 9)

- 2 English
- 1 Math
- 1 Science
- 1 History/Social

Science



## Modifications

- Expand the use of performance assessment and reduce the number of credits verified by SOL tests
- Increase internships and work-based learning experiences
- Emphasize the "5Cs"
  - Critical & Creative Thinking
  - Collaboration
  - Communication
  - Citizenship (aka Civic duty)






### **Project-based Learning**
