Examples of Working Group Principles: Community Facilities Study

- Make maximum use and re-use of facilities we have
- Encourage joint or shared use facilities
- Take opportunities to create more land
- Build up, under and over rather than out
- Institutionalize collaboration between the County and APS

Examples of Working Group Principles: 4MRV Area and Parks Master Plan

- Create a cohesive plan for the entire study area
- Balance Countywide and neighborhood needs, accommodating current and future demand
- Consider affordable, creative, and functional solutions that can be implemented incrementally
- Buffer noise-generating uses with trees, landscaping and other elements
- Celebrate the area's history and culture, especially the community's African American heritage and the history of Jennie Dean Park
