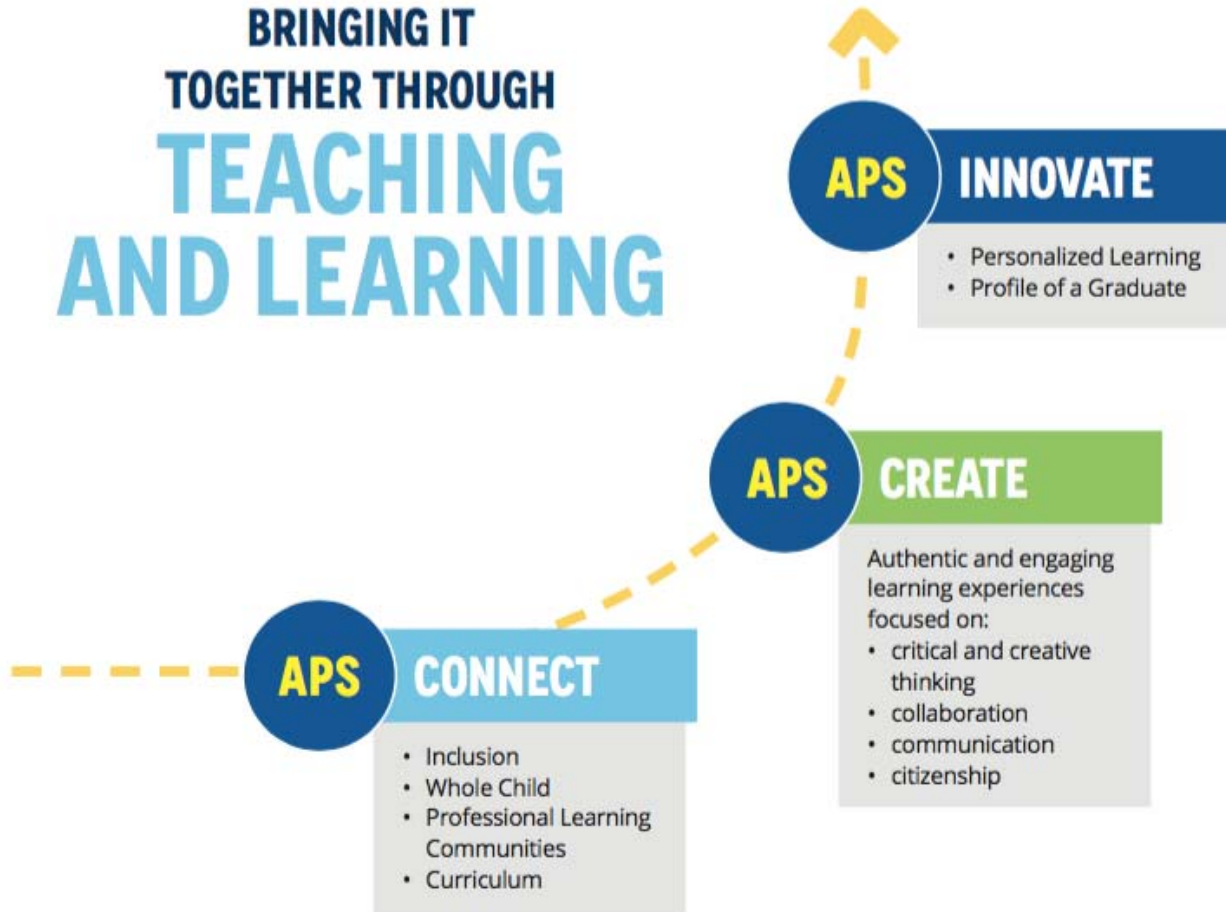

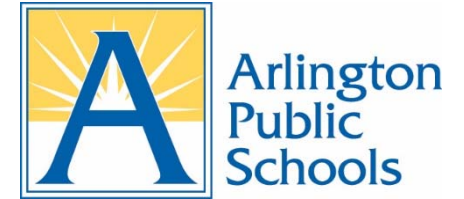
Teaching and Learning

Critical thinking: reason effectively, use systems thinking, make judgments and decisions, solve problems

Creative thinking: think creatively, work creatively with others, implement innovations

Collaboration: ability to work effectively and respectfully with diverse teams, exercise flexibility, assume shared responsibility

Communication: articulate thoughts and ideas effectively, communicate for a range of purposes, use multiple media and technologies

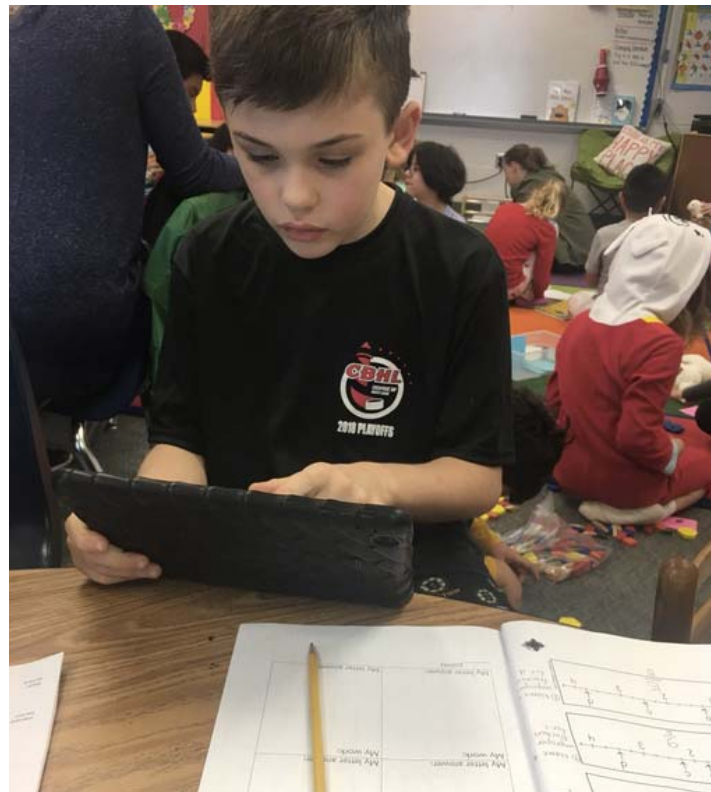
Citizenship: build connections and value for interactions as a responsible and responsive citizen



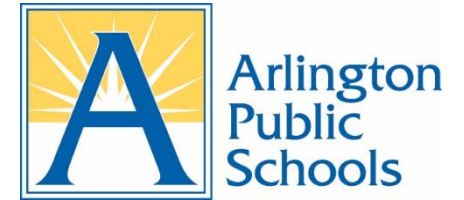

Defining Policies and PIPs



Policy

A policy is a concise statement of School Board policy on a topic or issue. A policy reflects Board statement of its beliefs, desired outcomes, and evaluation for a given issue or topic. A policy may include guidelines or direction the Board provides to the Superintendent and staff on a given issue or topic (30-3.1 Policy and Policy Implementation Procedures).

- Principles of action
- Intended to shape decisions
- Answers “what” and “why” questions
- Defines broad terms

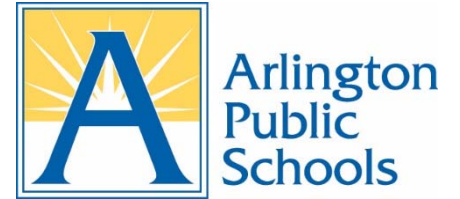
Policy Implementation Procedures (PIPs)

A Policy Implementation Procedure (PIP) includes the specific responsibilities, procedures, timelines, and schedule for implementation of a given policy. Revised or new PIPs are approved by the Superintendent (30-3.1 Policy and Policy Implementation Procedures).

- Define management and operations of the school system in accordance with School Board policies
- Answer the “how”, “who”, and “when” questions
- Define specific operational terms



Acceptable Use Policies

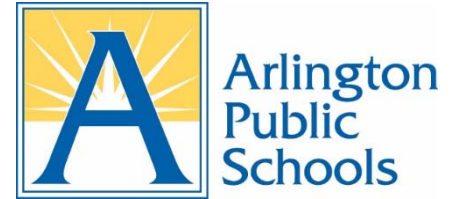


Acceptable Use Policies (AUPs) have two dimensions. They:

- Protect students from harmful content on the Internet and regulate students use of the Internet so they do not harm other students or interfere with the school's instructional program
- Provide students with access to digital media to support engaged learning



Acceptable Use Policies (AUP)



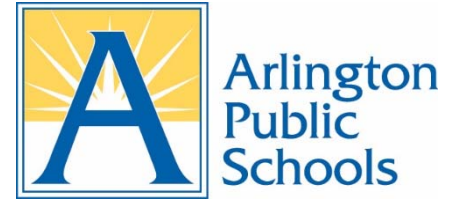
An AUP outlines how a district “expects its community members to behave with technology” and may include:

- A statement of the vision, philosophy, or mission to frame the intent of the AUP
- Alignment with any existing code of conduct (ethical and legal responsibilities)
- Clear definitions of acceptable use and unacceptable use
- Shared ownership and responsibility
- Safety and privacy

Acceptable Use Policies



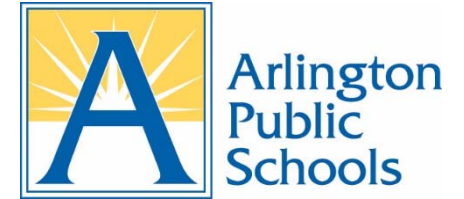

Electronic Technologies Acceptable Use Policy

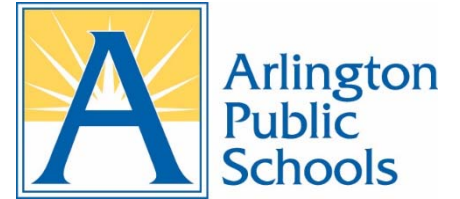

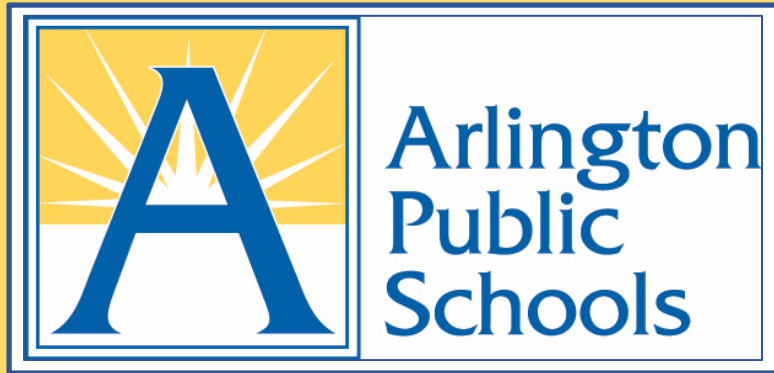
