Changes to the 2018-2027 Projections:


APS has been working closely with Arlington County Government (ACG) to align the population forecasts with the APS enrollment projection process. As of 2018, APS has incorporated the following ACG data/resources:

- Housing Unit Database
- Housing Unit Forecast
- Timeline of Residential Construction
- Estimation of Long-Term Births


In addition, Spring 2018 APS projections include several other updates:

- Actual sibling transfers


Current (2017) 10-year Projections for Grades 9-12




Comparison of Current (2017) to 2016 Projections



Comparison of Current (2017) to 2016 Projections




Comparison of Current Projections to Permanent Seats *




Comparison assumes permanent seats at current class size levels
