Role of Open Space in CCWG - Adopted Charge (Nov 2017)

KEY PARAMETERS (P.2):

The County's adopted goals and policies on parks and **open space**, land use, transportation, parking, accessibility, energy, sustainability and the environment, public safety and education, and others as applicable.

Articulation of the consequences, costs and benefits of buildings, programs, program moves, **amenities**, etc. proposed in both the long-and short-term.

FOR 2022 (P.2):

Determine how to optimize the height, massing, placement of buildings and **open space**, site circulation and traffic impacts of this phase of development in the context of the Columbia Pike Initiative Revitalization Plan, the Form Based Code, the S-3A zoning district, all other applicable planning documents, and the surrounding neighborhoods.

FOR 2022 & BEYOND (P.2):

Determine if the site can accommodate additional **shared community facilities**; if so, identify general priorities, schedule and cost implications, and potential modifications to the Zoning Ordinance for height, massing, **open space** and parking,

FACILITY SPECIFIC GOALS (P.3):

Recommend how APS and the County could **optimize the use of existing stadiums**, **ball fields**, **and tracks and other recreational resources** with particular attention to shared-use potential.

VHSL Athletic Participation

Virginia High School League (VHSL) – https://www.vhsl.org/

- Categorizes member schools into six classifications for competition
- Each class is based on enrollment and equal distribution of schools
- Schools are grouped based on geographical districts
- Maintains eligibility for 27 sports (14 for girls and 13 for boys)
- Enrollment requirements for <u>full-time</u>, <u>on-site students</u> are as follows:

Class 2	476 – 766	George Mason HS, Falls Church (52 Schools)





Available Outdoor Fields near Career Center site




GROUP EXERCISES

Open Spaces, Field Spaces & Athletics

Group Exercises will focus on the following potential outcomes related to field space and athletics on the Career Center site:

- A. An **option school** is incorporated into the Career Center site and does not require on-site field spaces for competition. The parking garage with green space on top still becomes available on day 1.
- B. A **neighborhood school** is incorporated into the Career Center site. The parking garage with field space on top is available on day 1.
- C. A **neighborhood school** is incorporated into the Career Center site. The parking garage with field space on top does <u>not</u> become available initially.

CCWG members will be separated into 3 groups:



STATION A:

Prioritization of on-site open space (20 min)

20 Minute Exercise:

- Parking garage with green space above replaces the current surface parking lot
- Competitive field space is not required for option school
- What is the optimal use of that green space?
- Stakeholders can consider scaled amenities such as playground and non-competitive athletic courts or simply suggest un-programmed areas

STATION B:

Spectator seating options for on-site field space (20 min)

20 Minute Exercise:

- Neighborhood school is incorporated into the Career Center site
- All existing buildings remain in place (Career Center, Patrick Henry, and Fenwick)
- Parking garage with 1 multi-purpose field space above replaces the surface parking lot
- Where can spectator seating be accommodated within the physical constraints of the site and considering the required dimensions for various sport fields?
- Stakeholders can consider a number of options for seating arrangements

STATION C:

Off-site field space options (20 min)

20 Minute Exercise:


- Neighborhood school is incorporated into the Career Center site
- All existing buildings remain in place (Career Center, Patrick Henry, and Fenwick)
- Parking garage with 1 multi-purpose field space above is <u>not</u> initially available on site
- For purposes of VHSL competition, which off-site field spaces can Career Center students utilize for practice and home games?
- County-wide map of all field spaces will be provided along with matrix of considerations for each site
- Based on existing programming, stakeholders will have a limited number of choices available

Field types impact how future needs are met

- By 2035, the County anticipates a need for additional 11 rectangular and 2 diamond fields
- There are different ways we can meet the estimated need:
 - Create a new field
 - Any combination of converting existing fields to synthetic and/or add lights
 - Create additional multi-use field
