VPAP Workshops for Civics Teachers

Summer training opportunity for middle and high school civics teachers. The nonpartisan, nonprofit Virginia Public Access Project is accepting applications for one-day sessions to be held throughout the state including Fairfax County (GMU) - June 26 and Hampton Roads (WHRO) - June 28. The workshops will focus on ways to incorporate VPAP's data visualizations and other resources into lesson plans covering topics such as elections, the legislative process and redistricting.
