FEBRUARY 4, 2019 APS DESEGREGATION: A 60TH ANNIVERSARY TRIBUTE

Honoring the Past, Envisioning the Future

Join APS School Board Chair, Reid Goldstein, and other School Board members, along with community members, former students, and special guests to remember those who desegregated Stratford Jr. High and Arlington Public Schools in February of 1959. Arrive at 6 p.m. to explore artifacts and art; the formal presentation will begin at 6:30 p.m.

Arlington Public Art, in partnership with the County's Historic Preservation Program, is collaborating with visiting printmaker Amos Kennedy to create a commemorative print that honors the 60th anniversary of the desegregation of Stratford Junior High School (now Dorothy Hamm Middle School). Kennedy creates prints, posters and postcards from handset wood and metal type, oil-based inks, and eco-friendly and affordable chipboard. Many of the posters are inspired by proverbs, sayings, and quotes he has researched. His working method often involves overprinting multiple layers of text, resulting in no two prints being truly identical.
