- 2. Public Comment (Josh Folb representing Arlington Education Association)
 - a. Some concerns around the Amazon announcement and something AEA will be watching
 - b. Concerns that buying power of salaries today will buy less in the future
 - c. Small percentage of APS staff actually live in Arlington
 - d. Amazon effect
 - i. Higher costs in Arlington, particularly for those who rent in Arlington
 - e. There was discussion around the Amazon talking points put out by Arlington Economic Development
 - i. Recommendation to irculate and watch the press announcement on Facebook live
- 3. Liaison Reports
 - a. FAC (Stacy Snyder and Lida Anestidou)
 - i. Important to keep an eye on how Amazon impacts our need for school seats in Arlington
 - 1. We urge APS and the County to work together more closely on these issues
 - b. CCPTA (Cecilia)
 - i. Large disparity across PTA budgets in Arlington
 - ii. Policies around what expenses PTAs can fund or not fund
 - iii. SEPTA new PTA for Special Education
 - There are a lot of resources available across the county but they are not optimized in terms of people knowing how to consume these services
 - c. ACI no liaison
 - d. ECBC (Bob)
 - i. Meetings are happening but not a lot of input happening
 - ii. Discussion around whether the Education Center needs flexibility to be converted into an elementary school in the future
 - e. ACTC (Josh Folb)
 - i. David is going to serve as our liaison on the committee going forward
 - ii. How to get kids out of buses and into alternative modes
 - 1. Discussion about the need for improved crosswalks
- 4. County Close-out Funds
 - a. \$21.9 million in total
 - i. Hold \$16.5 million for anticipated shortfalls
 - ii. \$3.4 million into reserve (includes \$3.0 million for APS)

- iii. Balance for unplanned needs
- 5. Partnership Discussion
 - a. National Alliance for Mental Illness (NAMI) (Jeanne Comeau)
 - i. Education and support programs for individuals and community members living with mental health condition
 - 1. 15 full time employees and 150+ volunteers
 - ii. Partners with other non-profits and agencies (school, courts, etc.)
 - iii. NAMI does not have a specific recommendation for APS in terms of the ideal staffing levels for social workers/psychologists
 - iv. NAMI working on programs that are geared towards elementary schools; most programs today geared towards middle and high schools
 - v. NAMI does not have a formal partnership with APS to provide services
 - b. Potential partnership with Northern Virginia Community College (NOVA)
 - i. They have closer ties with Fairfax and Alexandria than Arlington
 - ii. There are interesting opportunities to work together
