

CONSISTENCY and ACCOUNTABILITY

Needed throughout: across all schools, curriculums, programs Includes support: provide knowledge/material/other elements needed for success

EQUITY

At least one year of growth for every child everywhere. Period.

Equity also built through school communities; will require training, education and modeling

EVIDENCE-BASED INSTRUCTION

Must be data-driven Must be implemented with fidelity

Other Important/Commonly-expressed Thoughts/Emphases:

- Teaching reading; & please get rid of Balanced Literacy/Lucy Calkins
- Teaching research and writing
- Student mental health/stress: thank you for emphasis; please continue
- Bullying: very large concern
- Changes in grading policies
- Summer school change
- Communication/engagement with parents
- Changing next year's calendar & this late
- Middle school starts too early
- Technology use
- Broad inconsistencies: Example, 50% of schools not providing the needed 90 min/wk FLES instruction
- Praise for many teachers/staff; please emphasize recruiting early, providing training, & retention


