TEACCH TIP #1- Visual Schedule

TEACCH TIP #1 is to use a visual schedule to explain what daily activities will be happening and where they will occur. Showing an individual with autism a daily schedule <u>visually</u> helps them to understand the sequence of activities throughout their day, including play time, academics, meals, chores, and other daily tasks. You can use objects, pictures, or written words, whichever method the individual best understands.



 favorite things.
