Work Session on English/Language Arts Academic Update Thursday, January 16, 2020

The Arlington School Board convened on Thursday, January 16, 2020, at 7:03 PM at 2110 Washington Blvd., Arlington, Virginia.

Ms. Silver began the Work Session by providing an overview of the agenda. She then presented detailed information on the English Language Arts (ELA) program at APS. She explained the alignment of ELA and the 2018-24 Strategic Plan to ensure student success. The presentation consisted of a lengthy review of relevant data collection and the assessments used to measure success including

- Standards of Learning (SOL) Data
- Phonological Awareness Literacy Screening (PALS) Data
- Rapid Automatic Naming (RAN) Screener Information and Data
- Reading Inventory (RI) Data

Ms. Graves and Ms. Apostolico-Buck spoke about ELA at their schools. They shared about highlights and complexities related to literacy instructional support. Ms. Whipp spoked about her experience as a reading teacher and the impact the curriculum has in the classrooms.

Furthermore, Ms. Silver also shared recommendations to improve the ELA program, support core instruction, and provide professional development. Lastly, she talked about recommendations from the ELA program evaluation and actions steps to achieve each initiative.

The Board discussed concerns related to identifying struggling readers, interventions and resources to accommodate the diverse student demographic, civil right challenges, professional development, and writing. The Board also discussed the different assessment tools and student achievement, and budget implications.

In closing, the Board and the Interim Superintendent thanked staff for their work and leadership.
