Impact of Pandemic on this Boundary Process

- Due to the pandemic and stress on families, APS narrowed the focus of this process to make only boundary adjustments needed as a result of the Fall 2021 opening of a new neighborhood school at the Key site and the new building at the Reed site, as well as the need to place ASFS within its boundaries
- Nov. 5 Superintendent's recommendation called for minimal adjustments to elementary school boundaries in 2021-22 and preserved flexibility for a broader, countywide elementary school boundary process in Fall 2022
- Nov. 24 School Board adjustments to the Superintendent's boundary recommendation involve 11 Planning Units in the attendance zones for ASFS, the new elementary school at Key, and Taylor



Superintendent's Elementary School Boundary Recommendation with School Board Adjustments

The Superintendent's boundary recommendation with School Board adjustments:

- Involves six schools (ASFS, Ashlawn, McKinley, Taylor, Tuckahoe, and new school at Key site)
- Reassigns 33 Planning Units and about 630 Grade K-4 students (Sept. 30, 2020 enrollment) to other neighborhood schools
- Adds about a projected 650 more walkers across the schools involved
- Allows for all current Grade 4 students at the other schools involved in this boundary process (McKinley, Ashlawn, ASFS, Taylor) who are affected by a boundary reassignment to be eligible for grandfathering for Grade 5 in the 2021-22 school year
- Allows for all Tuckahoe students in <u>PU 16061</u>, which is reassigned to McKinley at Reed, to remain at Tuckahoe through grandfathering until new boundaries take effect in 2023-24.



Superintendent's Elementary School Boundary Recommendation with School Board Adjustments

The Superintendent's recommendation with School Board Adjustments achieves these objectives:

- Creates a new attendance zone for new neighborhood elementary school at the Key site and an adjusted attendance zone for most of McKinley in the new building at Reed
- Places all schools within their attendance zones
- Brings enrollment to more manageable levels at ASFS, Ashlawn, McKinley and Taylor
- Preserves flexibility for broader countywide elementary school boundary process in 2022
- Allows for instructional visioning and FY 2022 CIP to be used as guidance in next boundary process

Grandfathering Recommendation: Eligibility

PU 16061—Eligible for Grandfathering

**Transportation will not be provided for grandfathered students

All current students in Grades K-4 who reside in PU 16061, which is proposed for reassignment to McKinley at Reed, will be eligible to remain at Tuckahoe through grandfathering until new boundaries take effect in 2023-24.

- It is the only Tuckahoe PU assigned to the Reed site (which is located within this PU)
- Families in this PU have expressed that they want to attend Reed, but note that this PU is the only one reassigned from Tuckahoe and, therefore, would like their students to have the option to continue at Tuckahoe
- Tuckahoe has the capacity to accommodate these students, who can remain there through the 2022-23 school year



Grandfathering Recommendation: Eligibility

Grade 4—Eligible for Grandfathering

**Transportation will not be provided for grandfathered students

All current Grade 4 students at the other schools involved in this process—Ashlawn, ASFS, McKinley and Taylor—who reside in a Planning Unit that is affected by a boundary reassignment will be eligible to remain at their current schools through grandfathering for Grade 5 in the 2021-22 school year.

- Grandfathering includes current Grade 4 students who are attending ASFS through team and sibling transfers. These students will be eligible to remain at ASFS for Grade 5 in the 2021-21 school year.
- Grandfathering eligibility applies to current Grade 4 students who are enrolled in APS as of Dec. 7, 2020.
- Transfers All Grade K-3 students attending Ashlawn, McKinley, Taylor and Tuckahoe through transfers can continue at their current schools.

Grandfathering Recommendation: Eligibility

Not Eligible for Grandfathering

- Students currently in PreK through Grade 3 (in the 2020-21 school year)
- Siblings of current Grade 4 students
- Students in Grades K-3 who are attending ASFS through team and sibling transfer
- Grade 4 students who register or re-enroll in APS after Dec. 7, 2020 and reside in a Planning Unit that is reassigned in this boundary process. These students:
 - Can attend their assigned 2020-21 neighborhood school, or
 - If space is available, can apply for a transfer to their assigned 2021-22 neighborhood school for the remainder of the 2020-21 school year

Grandfathering Recommendation: Process

If the School Board's boundary decision includes grandfathering, then the process will be as follows:

- Families in Planning Units that are reassigned to another school attendance zone per School Board decision will be notified in mid- to late December via the U.S.
 Postal Service and ParentVue.
- Families eligible for grandfathering will be notified that they are eligible and provided with information at this time, also via postal service and ParentVue.
- Information sent to eligible families in Planning Units that have been reassigned to another school will include documentation that families must complete and return before the stated deadline.
- In January, registrars will call eligible families who have not responded

Fall 2022 Elementary School Boundary Process

In Fall 2022, APS will conduct a countywide Elementary School Boundary Process for implementation in 2023-24

- The Fall 2022 Elementary School Boundary Process will have a broader, countywide scope.
- In 2022, APS will seek to avoid reassigning PUs that are reassigned in the 2020 process.
 - It is possible that PUs reassigned in this process could be considered for reassignment in the broader countywide 2022 boundary process.
- Any PU that is not reassigned to another school in the 2020 process—including PUs that move with a school—could be considered for reassignment in the 2022 process.
- APS will manage enrollment to provide relief at schools that are over capacity.
- The 2022 process will focus on boundary policy considerations and efficiencies:
 - Planning Units that are walkable to schools will be considered for reassignment to that school
 - All Planning Units that require transportation to their neighborhood school will be considered for reassignment to another nearby school with capacity

School Board Motion on Elementary School Boundaries







Due to the pandemic and stress on families, APS narrowed the focus of this process to make only boundary adjustments needed as a result of the Fall 2021 opening of a new neighborhood school at the Key site and the new building at the Reed site, as well as the need to place ASFS within its boundaries.

The Superintendent's recommendation with School Board adjustments reassigns 33 Planning Units and a projected 1,040 K-5 students to other neighborhood elementary schools beginning in SY 2021-2022, and preserves flexibility for a broader, countywide elementary school boundary process in Fall 2022.

The Superintendent's recommendation with School Board Adjustments:

- Creates a new attendance zone for a new neighborhood elementary school at the Key site and an adjusted attendance zone for most of McKinley in the new building at the Reed site
- Places all schools within their attendance zones
- Preserves flexibility for a broader countywide elementary school boundary process in 2022
- Allows for instructional visioning and the FY 2022 CIP and FY 2023 CIP to be used as guidance in the next elementary school boundary process



Therefore, I move that the School Board approve the Superintendent's recommendation with School Board Adjustments. This recommendation will reassign the following Elementary School Planning Units to new attendance zones as presented in the table below:

I also move that current Grade 4 students at Ashlawn, ASFS, McKinley, and Taylor who were affected by a boundary reassignment will be eligible for grandfathering for grade 5 in SY 2021-2022.

Current Grade 4 students who are attending ASFS through Team and Sibling transfers will be eligible to remain at ASFS for grade 5 in SY 2021-2022.

All students attending Ashlawn, McKinley, Taylor, and Tuckahoe through transfers can continue at their current schools.

In addition, all current Grade K-4 Tuckahoe students who reside in PU 16061, which is reassigned to McKinley at the Reed site, will be eligible to be grandfathered at Tuckahoe through SY 2022-2023.

Transportation will not be provided for grandfathered students.



I further direct the Superintendent to:

- Implement a mechanism to reduce Abingdon's enrollment that will take effect in SY 2021-2022
- Undertake a countywide process to manage elementary school enrollment in SY 2022-2023 that will take effect in SY 2023-2024 and will include boundary changes and other tools

Notes:

- Students who are eligible to remain at their current school due to grandfathering would still have the option to attend their newly-assigned neighborhood school in SY 2021-2022.
- Students must be enrolled in APS as of Dec. 7, 2020 to be eligible for grandfathering.
- In addition to notifying current families in the Planning Units involved, APS will also reach out to families of Grade 4 students in the reassigned PUs who withdrew through Dec. 7, 2020 to confirm whether their student will reenroll for 2021-22 and if they want to be grandfathered with their current neighborhood school.
