### What is the Advisory Council on Teaching and Learning?

The Advisory Council on Teaching and Learning (ACTL) is an advisory committee that reports to the School Board and the Department of Teaching and Learning (DTL) to help improve learning outcomes for every student. We need family and community representatives and are welcoming volunteers as we enter the new school year.

## How Can I Get Involved?

### 1. Become an ACTL School or Community Representative -

Your participation in ACTL will provide your school and community organization with a voice on APS instructional programs and allow valuable feedback on what are your school or community organization's goals, challenges and what is working with your students and clientele. This committee meets once a month to learn from senior leadership from DTL and other APS staff about initiatives, to share experiences about teaching and learning through focused conversations, and to provide feedback on improvements.

#### 2. Become an ACTL Department Committee Member -

ACTL Department Committees include 13 committees, each focused on a department within DTL. You do not need to be a subject-matter expert or an ACTL member to join, and there is no limit on the number of people from any school who can join. These committees meet once/month to engage with departments about student learning and to develop recommendations and progress memos. Each committee presents their recommendations and progress memos to the ACTL school and community committee on a regular basis.
