March 24, 2022

The Arlington School Board convened on Thursday, March 24, 2022 at 5:30 PM at 2110 Washington Blvd., Arlington, Virginia.¹

A. CALL TO ORDER AND CLOSED MEETING

Dr. Kanninen called the meeting to order and moved that the Board immediately convene in a closed meeting for consultation with legal counsel and a briefing by staff pertaining to litigation as authorized by Virginia Code §2.2-3711(A)(7); and for consultation with legal counsel regarding specific legal matters requiring the provision of legal advice by such counsel as authorized by Virginia Code §2.2-3711(A)(8), seconded by Mr. Priddy. The motion was adopted in a vote of 5 – 0, with Ms. Diaz-Torres, Mr. Goldstein, Ms. Kadera, Dr. Kanninen, and Mr. Priddy voting affirmatively.

Dr. Kanninen moved to certify that pursuant to 22.2-3712(D) of the Code of Virginia to the best knowledge of each School Board member, only public business matters lawfully exempted from open meeting requirements by Virginia law were discussed in the closed meeting just held, and only such public business matters as were identified in the motion convening this closed meeting were heard, discussed, or considered. The motion was seconded by Ms. Kadera and was adopted in a vote of 5 - 0. 1. Board Announcements:

Dr. Kanninen announced that the Board was accepting nominations for the Honored Citizens Award and encouraged the community to nominate outstanding volunteers who have devoted over five years of commitment to APS and exemplify the core values.

As the liaison to Wakefield High School, Ms. Kadera applauded the Wakefield Orchestra performance. She announced that March 21st was World Down Syndrome Day and that the Harris Teeter on Glebe Road would display student art from Glebe Elementary School in the construction fence. Mr. Goldstein shared about the unveiling of the Mary Lockwood Commemorative Plaque in honor of the Women's Suffrage Movement at Arlington Traditional Elementary School and about upcoming activities at his liaison schools.

2. Superintendent's Announcements and Updates

Dr. Durán encouraged the community to participate in providing input on several surveys. He spoke the about the School Bell Times Study Survey that APS was conducting as part of the APS School Bell Times Study to gather input on possible scenarios for reducing the variations in school start and end times. The input received would inform final recommendations to the School Board to be presented on April 28 and slated for a vote on May 12. Bell changes would take effect in the 2022-23 school year. He then talked about the 2022 Your Voice Matters Survey that covered topics such as school climate, student well-being and employee and family engagement. He also announced the Social Emotional Learning (SEL) Screener Survey for Students in Grades 3-12 Survey to help APS identify, report, and address all students' social-emotional and academic needs. Dr. Durán announced that the new APS Student Progress Dashboard would launch on March 25. The new online dashboard will show student progress in English Language Arts and Mathematics, beginning with the 2019-20 school year. He shared brief information on literacy and math and how the data gathered from the assessments would identify students who need interventions. Lastly, he shared about the Women's Suffrage Marker event at Arlington Traditional Elementary School and congratulated the National Scholastic Art Awards 2022 medalists.

Mr. Priddy suggested increasing communications about the Your Voice Matters Survey to increase participation. The Board appreciated the launch of the Academic Dashboard to provide comprehensive academic information and transparency to the community. Ms. Diaz-Torres noted that the dashboard was part of long-time work from staff to share information. Ms. Kadera inquired about school staff engagement of the Bell Study Survey.

F. MONITORING ITEMS (8:22 PM):

1. Security Update

Mr. Zachary Pope, Director, Safety, Security, Risk and Emergency Management, explained that the Department of Safety, Security, Risk and Emergency Management provides a comprehensive protection, prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery services across the school division in collaboration with Arlington County and regional and federal agencies. He presented the key School Board Policies that govern the department, its alignment with the Strategic Plan Performance Objective 16 and compliance in the Emergency Management Accreditation Program (EMAP) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI). He explained the myriad of areas that APS must follow regulations related to Occupational Safety and Health (OSHA), County Ordinance, and Code of Virginia. He highlighted the APS COVID-19 response and opportunities to improve safety, security, risk, and emergency management as a school division.

The Board briefly discussed the emergency management responses for incidents at such as those at Wakefield High School and ways to enhance training, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) reimbursement timeline and addressing other areas of concern. The Board appreciated the tremendous work related to COVID-19 pandemic.

2. Special Education Update

Ms. Heather Rothenbuescher, Director of Secondary Special Education, presented the mission and vision statement of the Office of Special Education. Ms. Rothenbuescher and Ms. Kelly Krug, Director of Elementary Special Education, shared a detailed summary of the Special Education 5-Year Action Plan developed to strategically address the long-term quality of programs and services for students with disabilities and students requiring interventions. In addition, Ms. Krug presented the priorities to continue to build consistency across all APS schools to service students with disabilities which included new staffing allocations recommendations in the FY 2023 budget and collaboration with the math office.

The Board discussed the phased implementation plan for revised planning factors and the positive takeaways of the inclusive model for professional learning. Ms. Kadera shared her kudos on the different community engagement strategies.

H. INFORMATION ITEMS (9:29 PM):

1. Special Education Annual Plan

Ms. Krug presented an overview of the Annual Application Arlington Special Education that is required by the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) and provided a detailed description of how federal entitlement funds are

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spent as part of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) Part B Sections 611 and 619. Ms. Rothenbuescher presented the FY 23 Proposed Budget for mandated services.

2. FY 2021 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Entrances Renovation Project Update: Gunston Middle School Entrance Renovation Construction Contract Award

Mr. Jeffrey Chambers, Director Design and Construction, proposed that the contract be awarded to the lowest responsive and qualified bidder, The Matthews Group, Inc. in the amount of \$1,612,114 million, for the entrance renovation at Gunston Middle School. The project would relocate the primary school entrance and main office closer to S. Lang St, adjacent to the community theater. He presented a status update on the FY 2021 CIP Entrances Renovation Projects and the factors that caused an increase in projects cost.

The Board discussed the contractor being proposed, cost adjustments, and the impact of the proposed entrance renovation on the school community.

Dr. Kanninen moved to authorize staff to take all actions necessary as recommended and discussed in closed session, seconded by Ms. Diaz-Torres. the motion was adopted in a vote of 5-0.
