<sup>3</sup> IB Course Candidates are students who are taking IB courses but not working toward an IB Diploma, irrespective of grade level.

<sup>4</sup> As a result of the pandemic, VDOE provided students with disabilities who turned 22 after September 20, 2020 and were scheduled to complete high school in spring 2021 with the option to attend high school in school year 2021-22.

All students attending the Elementary Option Schools (Arlington Traditional, Campbell, Claremont, Escuela Key, and Montessori) participate in those programs. The monthly membership report monitors enrollment by grade level at those elementary option schools.
