Critical Crash Mitigation Campaign

- 5 campaign themes to promote behavior change identified in our systemic crash analysis findings
- Targeted to reduce severe crashes involving:
 - Speeding
 - Pedestrians
 - Drunk Driving
 - Bikes
 - Left Turns

SLOW DOWN SAVE LIVES





1 in 4 crashes in Arlington involves speeding.

EXPECT PEOPLE STOP FOR PEDESTRIANS



1 in 3 severe or fatal crashes in Arlington involves a pedestrian.

PLAN AHEAD DON'T DRINK & DRIVE




Drunk driving crashes are at least **twice** as likely to result in a serious injury or death.

EXPECT BIKES CHECK YOUR BLIND SPOT



1 in 3 severe bicycle crashes in Arlington involves a vehicle making a right turn.

TAKEYOUR TIME

1 in 5 severe crashes in Arlington involves making a left turn.

Critical Crash Mitigation Campaign



- Kick-off with a press release coinciding with the Year 1 Open House
- Monthly highlights on website, social media, newsletter, and sponsored content (ArlNow, SunGazette):
 - Bicycle Awareness (May)
 - Driving Under the Influence (June + Nov/Dec)
 - Speeding (July/August)
 - Awareness While Turning Left (Sept)
 - Pedestrian Awareness (Oct)
- Distribute targeted posters (businesses, CaBi stands w/ roadway visibility, high schools, public facilities, universities, driving schools, DMV, and other places within the community (AFSS to help distribute)
- Insert in the property tax or utility bill mailers (exploring options)
- Other potential sponsored content (exploring options)

Arlington County installed **demonstration School Slow Zones** around 13 schools in early 2022. A School Slow Zone is a permanent 20 mile-per-hour speed limit on a neighborhood street within 600 feet of a key access point to a school (learn more about school slow zones here).

Because School Slow Zones are a new safety treatment in Arlington, these demonstrations will test whether the School Slow Zone policy effectively reduces speeds around schools before installing them at all schools in the County. Please answer this seven-question form to help us understand how the demonstration projects are working and how they can be improved.

We will apply the feedback received via this form combined with before/after speed data to finalize our School Slow Zone policy and deploy such zones at all schools in Arlington over the next several years.

A principio de 2022, implementamos Zonas Escolares de Velocidad Reducida de demostración en alrededor de trece escuelas. Una Zona Escolar de Velocidad Reducida abarca un límite de velocidad de 20 millas por hora (MPH), que debe respetarse de forma permanente, en la calle de un vecindario dentro de los 600 pies de un punto de acceso principal a una escuela (aprenda más sobre las zonas escolares de velocidad reducida aquí).

Debido a que las Zonas Escolares de Velocidad Reducida conforman un enfoque de seguridad nuevo en Arlington, estas demostraciones comprobarán si efectivamente, con las políticas de zonas escolares de velocidad reducida, se reduce la velocidad alrededor de los establecimientos escolares antes de implementarlas en todas las escuelas del Condado. School Zone Speed Camera Guidelines

- January July 2022
- DES + ACPD + APS Collaboration
- Conducted peer review of best practices / Developing criteria for prioritizing & selecting speed camera locations / Creating guidelines for implementation of camera
- Target to implement in collaboration with ACPD at the launch of the speed camera program (2023)

Universal Traffic Garden Toolkits/Templates

- Kicks off soon; Likely 6-month duration
- DES + APS + Bike/WalkArlington + Prince George's County Collaboration
- Developing Traffic Garden Design & Installation Manual (DIY traffic garden manual for any budget) / Crafting traffic garden templates for varying types of spaces
- Target for school staff to easily implement traffic gardens on-site using the manual/templates
