Standard Diploma

Advanced Studies Diploma

- 3 high school credits in a single world language *OR*
- 2 credits each in 2 languages (total of 4 credits)
- Accommodations are available for students with disabilities and IEPs. SB 323

Earning High School Credit by Examination

Students who have proficiency in a world language may take an examination and earn up to a possible 3 world language credits. The test is given once a year in many languages. Students enrolled in 4th year language or language AP or IB are also tested in that language.
