

SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING SURVEY RESULTS

Elementary Parent/Guardian Information Session

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APS students in Grades 3-12 recently participated in the Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) Survey. SEL is the process through which all young people and adults acquire and apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes to develop healthy identities, manage emotions and achieve personal and collective goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain supportive relationships, and make responsible and caring decisions (CASEL, 2021).

The SEL Survey results are a report of your student's self-reported strengths and experiences at a particular moment in time. Survey results are reported in the areas of Self-Management, Growth Mindset, Social Awareness and Self-Efficacy.

Schools will use the survey results along with other data to inform practices for SEL skill development and support student social emotional needs. This data also will help staff and families partner together to promote student success.







This presentation will explain SEL terms, provide specific examples of the skills involved, and include tips for parents to help their children develop healthy, productive social-emotional skills.











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
