Transition

- transition | tran'zi sh Ən; si sh Ən |
 - NOUN: the process or a period of changing from one state or condition to another: students in transition from one program to another
 - <u>VERB</u>: undergo or cause to undergo a process or period of transition: many students will transition from PreK to Kindergarten in September

DERIVATIVES

• ORIGIN mid 16th cent.: from French, or from Latin transitio(n-), from transire 'go across.'

- Most kindergarten students attend their neighborhood home school.
- Families may also explore option schools. Information on option schools and <u>elementary school information sessions</u> will be available online by Kindergarten Information Night on Monday, January 31, 2023 at 6:30pm.
- Families of children receiving special education services will also have the opportunity to work with other members of their child's IEP team to determine appropriate placements and services.

Pre-K Staff

Includes:

- Supporting families
- Attending IEP Meetings
- Collaborating with receiving school staff
- Preparing child for transition


Role of the Receiving School

Receiving School Staff

May include:

- Observations at Pre-K Program
- Consultation/collaboration with Pre-K staff
- School-based planning
- IEP Meetings

There is a <u>Student Support Coordinator</u> assigned to each school.



Role of the Family



Family

- Be proactive! You are the **constant** member of your child's team.
- Seek support from school-based team members, PRC and other resources.
- Attend Kindergarten Information Night.
- Attend school-based information sessions.
- Let your team know if you are considering option schools (i.e. ATS, Campbell, Montessori or immersion schools, etc.)
- Work as a member of your Pre-K team to identify your child's needs.
- Be an active member of the IEP team.
- Prepare your child for the transition.

IEPs in Kindergarten

What changes should I expect in my child's program?

- Services are based on your child's needs.
- You are part of the team that determines what program is best for your child.
- Related services (therapy, transportation, etc.) are provided as needed.

Transition IEP Meetings

▶ IEP team meets to discuss child's present levels of performance, develop annual goals, identify required special education and related services, and determine the LRE (least restrictive environment).



Special Education Service Delivery Models

- Least Restrictive Environment (LRE) and special education continuum of services within Arlington Public Schools may include one or a combination of the models below:
 - Monitoring
 - Services in general education classroom
 - Services in special education environments
 - Countywide special education programs
